



ACTUARIAL SCIENCE BURSARY APPLICATION

NB: Most of the information below is intended for applicants from the Matric class into the first year Actuarial Science class. Current Actuarial Science students must only take note of the information applicable to them. A fully completed application with all relevant supporting documentation MUST be sent to applications@saadp.co.za

1. You will need

- 1.1 To have access to the internet.
- 1.2 To have an active email address through which we will interact with you regarding your application.
- 1.3 To have an active cell phone number on which you are reachable.

2. General application information

- 2.1 SAADP applications open on 02 January of the year preceding the year of study.
- 2.2 Applications are open to South African Matric learners applying for 1st year of study at any partner university (currently Wits, UCT or UP).
- 2.3 Any application to non-partner university will be automatically rejected.
- 2.4 Applications are also open to current Actuarial Science students from historically disadvantaged backgrounds, who have achieved good academic results in their first, second, or third year of their actuarial studies.
- 2.5 Current Actuarial Science students must be studying at Wits, UCT, or UP. Students from non-partner universities are welcome to apply, however they must have applied and been accepted to study at any of the partner universities.
- 2.6 Current Actuarial Science students that apply MUST be South African natives. Non-South Africans are unfortunately ineligible to apply.
- 2.7 Applicants may only apply once.
- 2.8 Applicants are welcome to download an application and fill it in by hand, scan it and email it to applications@saadp.co.za with relevant supporting documents. An application can be downloaded from www.saadp.co.za
- 2.9 Supporting documents that may not be available at the time of applying may be sent to applications@saadp.co.za whenever they become available, even after the closing date.
- 2.10 All shortlisted applications will be subjected to a stringent selection process, including interviews.
- 2.11 Applying for the bursary before the closing date is the applicant's responsibility.
- 2.12 Applying to university before the closing date is the applicants' responsibility.
- 2.13 Incomplete and/or late applications will not be considered.

3. About the bursary

- 3.1 SAADP relies on donations from private and public companies.
- 3.2 The award of bursaries is highly dependent on the availability of donations. Lack of donations results in no bursaries.
- 3.3 SAADP reserves the right not to award bursaries.
- 3.4 To apply, Matric learners must be doing well in Mathematics, English and Physical Sciences, achieving at least 80% in these subjects.
- 3.5 Matric learners from the Commercial stream are eligible to apply, however, they must apply to study Actuarial Science at the University of Cape Town. Presently, UCT does consider applicants with no Physical Sciences.
- 3.6 The SAADP bursary is renewable each year pending good academic performance.
- 3.7 DOCUMENTS to be submitted with the application form.

4. What will happen after applying?

All applications will go through the following stages:

STAGE 1: Pre-screening

Applications will be screened to check if they meet the following basic requirements:

- Whether the application was submitted before or on the closing date (31 August). SAADP may extend the closing date at its discretion.
- Whether the application has been completed in full.
- Whether the applicant has attached a Grade 11 final report and Grade 12 report showing term 1, 2, and 3 results (for Matric students only).
- Whether a final Statement of Results or National Senior Certificate has been submitted (for Matric students only).
- Whether the applicant has attached recent academic transcript (for current Actuarial Science students only).
- Whether the applicant has attached a recently certified ID copy or Birth Certificate (certified not earlier than 3 months ago).
- Whether your application meets the academic requirements for the university you intend to attend (for Matric learners only).

STAGE 2: Shortlisting

- Applications that meet the requirements (in stage 1) will be forwarded to the Students' Selection and Monitoring Committee – SSMC.
- The SSMC will screen applications further (NB: SAADP staff is not part of this process).
- Approved applications will be shortlisted, and the shortlist will be sent to the SAADP office for further processing.
- SAADP will communicate with only shortlisted applicants.
- Applicants that don't receive any communication from SAADP at the end of February after having submitted their final Statements of Results/NSC must accept that their applications have been unsuccessful.

STAGE 3: Submission of Statements of Results

- SAADP shall wait for the submission of final Statements of Results or NSC.
- It is the applicant's responsibility to submit their final Statement of Results or NSC to SAADP at applications@saadp.co.za
- Applicants that don't submit their Statements of Results or NSC to SAADP shall be assumed to be no longer interested in the SAADP bursary and shall be removed from the shortlist (if shortlisted).

STAGE 4: Selection interviews

- Shortlisted applicants from the Matric class that have submitted their final Statements of Results/NSC will be invited to attend a selection interview. *Please note that the selection interviews may be conducted virtually should Covid-19 regulations be reintroduced.*
- The selection interviews (for Matric applicants) are conducted by the SSMC. SAADP staff is not part of this interview process.
- Current Actuarial Science applicants will receive communication from SAADP advising them of the Selection Committee's decision.
- Successful applicants will be notified (by SAADP) of their interview outcome.
- The decision by the SSMC is final and no correspondence will be entered into.

ALL APPLICANTS MUST NOTE THAT:

- The South African Actuaries Development Programme is an independent Non-Profit Organisation mandated to consider applicants that only applied to study Actuarial Science at one of its partner universities, i.e. the University of the Witwatersrand, the University of Cape Town, and the University of Pretoria.
- SAADP only supports Actuarial Science students who have gone through its selection process and have been admitted into the programme.
- SAADP relies on donations from both the private and public companies to offer bursaries and pay for its operations. No bursaries may be offered if there are no donations received.
- All SAADP applicants are therefore encouraged to also apply for other potential funders that may be available.
- Due to the large number of applications received each year, applications must not expect any acknowledgement of receipt.
- If a Grade 12 learner has submitted his/her final Statement of Results in January and has still not received any response from us at the end of February, he or she must consider an application to be unsuccessful.
